

CHANGES TO LIQUIDS BAN EFFECTIVE 9-26-06

Transportation Security Administration
Security Level Remains at **Orange**



THE FOLLOWING RESTRICTIONS APPLY TO LIQUIDS, GELS, AND/OR AEROSOLS AT THE PASSENGER SCREENING CHECKPOINT

- ▶ No liquids, gels, and/or aerosols are permitted **EXCEPT** one clear transparent resealable 1 quart (1 liter) size plastic bag which may contain liquids, gels, and/or aerosols in containers of 3 oz. (90ml) capacity or less per container.
- ▶ The contents of the plastic bag must fit comfortably and the plastic bag must be completely closed/sealed and subjected to x-ray inspection separate from the passenger's carry-on bag.
- ▶ You may have the items listed below, but you **must declare** them to TSA at the screening checkpoint if they **are not contained in a clear transparent** resealable 1 quart (1 liter) size plastic bag and/or **are over 3 oz. (90ml).**
 - Baby formula/milk (to include breast milk) and baby food in containers if a baby or small child is traveling
 - Medications (liquid, gels, and/or aerosol)
 - Liquids (to include juice) or gels for diabetic or other medical needs
- ▶ **All other liquids, gels, and/or aerosols may be transported in checked baggage.**
- ▶ Liquids (including beverages), gels, and/or aerosols purchased in the sterile area may be carried onboard the aircraft

Increased security measures at the airport – The Jackson Municipal Airport Authority Department of Public Safety will be conducting random vehicle inspections at the entrance to the airport. All parking prohibitions will be strictly enforced. Patrons may park in any of the available lots for thirty minutes with no charge. Law enforcement officers will be posted at critical areas to provide for enhanced security.

Passenger Advisory – Passengers are advised to contact their airlines to confirm schedules and procedures prior to leaving for the airport. There may be cancellations and delays that will impact their schedules. Please pack wisely reducing the items to be carried onto the aircraft to the minimum possible. Passengers should plan to arrive at the airport two hours prior to departure to allow for potential delays due to heightened security procedures.
